SUBJECT: Important Information Regarding this Records Book.

Those familiar with previous versions of our basketball records books will notice this 2010 edition is significantly slimmer than previous volumes, and more major changes to all our publications are on the way in 2010-11.

Technology has provided the statistics staff a number of ways to improve the information we provide, as well as to deliver that information in a more efficient and timely fashion. That is why we eliminated the printed versions of most of our records books and statisticians' manuals in 2008-09 and why we will eliminate the printed version of the basketball records book in 2011.

Note this current records book includes all the records we always have published in previous years, but a number of sections no longer are part of this printed version, including results, awards, standings, etc. Those sections are not gone, but have moved to the online edition that can be accessed 24/7 on our NCAA Web sites.

For the past seven years, we have provided both a printed and online version for all our publications and have noticed that more and more users prefer the online edition. In fact, many of our member colleges and universities also have moved to online-only versions of their media guides.

All current and future online editions of our records books are fully searchable by key words and are "bookmarked" to allow for more flexibility. Users may prefer to move specific PDF sections of this book to their own desktop or even print selected pages and place them in a binder or folder. During the next few years, we anticipate improving the look of our online books, making them more interactive and allowing for more immediate updates during the season.

We hope you enjoy this edition of the NCAA Men's Basketball Records Book.
